About the Foundation

Since its inception, the Foundation has raised more than \$700,000 benefitting 30,000 ACES students and families. In 2016-17, the ACES Education Foundation raised \$109,000, and awarded \$90,500 in grants and Fund-A-Need initiatives to support programs in the 2017-18 school year. The Al Hopkins Memorial Scholarship Fund for Advanced Studies in the Arts awarded a total of \$3,000 in scholarships to two ACES Educational Center for the Arts students entering college.
